Report from Residents Association Meeting:

21 September 2015

St Mary's Social Centre

The trustees of the centre have received a letter confirming it is one of the sites that has been chosen by Lewes District Council for development. They plan to build nine houses and a new community centre on the site. In July the trustees and supporters met with LDC and the developer for a discussion. To their surprise the developers had not been briefed on the requirements for the new community centre. Their initial plans would not allow for a hall that would accommodate a hundred and eighty pantogoers, or a garden and playground for the nursery. The trustees acknowledge that the hall needs to be replaced as it is old and in need modernisation.

Community Orchard

The new orchard in Hawkenbury Way is doing well, and the organiser Gaynor Hartnell has plans to expand the planting. She is seeking volunteers to help her with this. If you are interested, ring her on 01273 472468 or e-mail gaynor1965@talktalk.net.

Police Report

PCSO Julie McNirlan reported that there had been a few minor incidents on Nevill. A car on the corner of North Way and Middle Way had been scratched, and some aerials had been found discarded in a nearby grit bin. She warned that there had been reports, one in Nevill and three in Winterbourne, of men offering gardening work, charging a lot of money for very little work.

Garden Trail

Vicki Trenhaile, who organised the Nevill Garden Trail on Sunday 5 July, said that the weather was perfect for the event. It was well attended and raised £638 for the Friends of Lewes Victoria Hospital. There were thirteen gardens, three of which were new to the trail. Three gardens offered teas, and others sold plants. Only seven people entered the scarecrow competition, which was disappointing. She thanked Fiona Griffin, for producing the poster and programmes, and St Mary's Panto for donating the prize tickets.

Environmental Budget

LDC Housing Department is waiting for a licence from ESCC to plant three cherry trees near the new seat opposite the shops in Highdown Road.

Nevill Green Play Area.

The society would like to thank residents for accommodating their 48th bonfire celebrations by keeping cars clear of the procession routes and cooperating with the temporary road traffic orders enforced throughout the evening.

Next Summer Event

Over four of the past 5 years the society has held a summer event on Nevill Green or, as in 2014, played a part in the Battle of Lewes celebration held at Landport Bottom. Although the society wasn't able to organise a similar event in 2015, it is hoped that we can put this right in 2016 encouraged by a similar level of support from the local community as it has enjoyed in the past. The event has shown that with the right weather, it is something residents are happy to attend, and that it can benefit a number of local clubs and organisations, not only financially but in terms of raising their profile. In the past the Society has worked with the Starfish organisation, which provides opportunities for young musicians within the town to develop their talents at their base in North Street, and it is hoped to continue this again.

The Society is now looking to try and repeat the success and royal theme after the Royal Wedding in 2011 and the Diamond Jubilee event in 2012. With the Queen's 90th birthday on Saturday 11th June 2016 it seems a fitting day to hold another **Extravaganza** on Nevill Green, and this is the date we are provisionally working towards. It is of course also another Olympic Games year.

As in past years we are looking to hold the event in two parts:-**Fayre between 12.00 to16.30 hrs** with displays, games, stalls, food and drink. We hope that as many local groups and clubs will come and have a stand at the event. We again will look to entertain visitors with arena events. This is likely to include ladies and men's Tug of War competitions between the bonfire societies for the bonfire cup; torch making competition; plus displays including possibly a local Morris Dance troupe. Additionally, there is hoped to be the very best of young local talent providing live music in one of the tents. Another tent is to provide the opportunity for children to learn to make lanterns and other craft skills.

Evening entertainment 18.00 to 22.00 hrs

As in the past, the society will be looking to have a stage with live music from several musicians and a headline band all supported with a hog roast and bar. At the conclusion of the evening there would be the opportunity to include a small firework display on the Green.

We are always looking to bring fresh ideas to the event and would welcome any ideas or suggestions. In terms of logistics, the society is always keen to know of anyone with tents, tables and chairs, or with vehicles to tow small trailers on the day. We are specially looking at how we can celebrate the 90th birthday element and wondering about the feasibility of providing a free tea for all the Nevill residents who have reached the age of 90 on or before 11th June. So far we have only heard of a couple - an incentive for all 89 year-olds to keep going!
