# 1. Diamond Jubilee Extravaganza 4th June 2012

The charge will be £5 per table: to be shared equally between NRA and NJBS. # 3. Residents Association meeting: 26 March 2012

Representatives from Southern Water and Lewes District Council came to our March meeting to advise residents of a change in law on the ownership of drains and sewers. Southern Water is now responsible for most shared drains and sewers, and the final runs from private boundaries to road sewers. Anyone experiencing problems should ring Southern Water on 0845 287 0845 (open 24 hrs for emergencies).

This was followed by discussion about the various flooding problems caused by heavy rain. To progress resolution of these issues,

the Council is drafting a "Surface Water Management Plan", which it hopes to present to the Association later in the year.

The District Council will begin a programme of gulley and kerb cleaning in the low lying areas during the week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> April. Leaflets will be distributed to all residents affected, asking them to keep their cars off the road on the appropriate day.

# 4. URGENT-Tenant's representatives needed

The Residents Association was set up in partnership with Lewes District Council, to improve housing services, the community and general environment.

To represent Council tenants, the Association is allowed two elective representatives on the 'Tenants of Lewes District Council' (TOLD) committee. This committee meets the Housing Senior Management Team to discuss housing issues, and influence housing services.

At the moment there is no council tenant on the NRA committee, so it needs someone to represent tenants' interest.

This is an opportunity for Nevill council tenants to make their opinions heard, especially as major changes are taking place in public sector housing. If you are interested in taking part, please contact Alan Chapman on 483501.

## 5. Environmental Budget Bids

Each year Carolyn Blayney, on behalf of the Association, applies for improvements to the estate. Last year she secured finance for handrails, to help the elderly on the approach to the shops. This year we are hoping for some financial support to install a seat outside the shops.

# 6. Neighbourhood Police Panel: 26 March 2012

The police agreed to the following three priorities.

- To continue to monitor parking congestion by exit at north end of Nevill Crescent onto Nevill Road.
- To maintain regular patrols in secluded areas, seeking to prevent burglaries from houses and gardens, and monitor parking around the shops in Highdown Road.
- To stop horse riders using pavements, especially on the west side of Nevill Road, near the Wallands School entrance.

# 7. Bus Service Update

A change in the 128 bus timetable is due to take place on 20<sup>th</sup> May: there will be more publicity nearer the time. The service will be slightly reduced, but we are in a much better position than other areas. To retain the service, we need to make good use of it, so please take the bus to town whenever possible. #### 8. Landport Bottom Update

Following the consultation last year, the Landport Bottom Management Committee has decided to adopt the present, more relaxed, restrictions for horse riding, cycling, and other recreational activities on Landport Bottom. We would like to thank Rob Elvery, one of our residents, who has been working with Dan Ross and others, to improve the access to Landport Bottom for walkers approaching north from the prison.

#### 9. Snow and Ice.

The new grit bins installed at the top of Mount Harry Road, and Middle Way, were fully used during the two days of snow we had at the beginning of the year, and are now completely empty. The Residents Association was surprised how quickly the

grit and salt disappeared, and will have to consider whether to spend another £75 to refill each one before the winter.

The snow shovels, bought last year by the Association, were used by members to clear pavements. If you need to borrow one when the snow returns, a list of the snow shovel holders is on the Association website.
